Research

MSM is home to world-renowned centers and institutes. Research priorities include: Cardiometabolic Diseases, HIV/Aids, Cancer and Neurological Disorders—all areas that disproportionately impact the underserved.

- Launched Georgia's first Mobile Clinical Research Unit, a bus with state-of-the-art equipment and technology used to conduct research
- Secured research grants and funding totaling more than \$243M over the past five years (2009-2014)
- MSM ranks third in the nation in federally funded research expenditures among communitybased medical schools
- MSM currently has 14 RO1 research grants from the National Institutes of Health
- Groundbreaking research and treatments for brain injuries, head and neck oncology, pelvic floor disorders, prostate cancer, and sleep disorders.

Patient Care

In September 2013, MSM opened Morehouse Healthcare. This state-of-the-art medical complex allows doctors to offer a comprehensive approach to patient care, with quick access to support services; the building hosts a multi-specialty outpatient surgery center, a medical imaging center, as well as other prominent practice groups.

In addition, MSM has 140+ physicians who staff Grady Memorial Hospital, one of the largest public hospitals in the Southeast. Along with other Atlanta medical schools, MSM is responsible for more than 600,000 patient visits at Grady annually.
