

Who is it for?

The Department of Family Medicine at Morehouse School of Medicine (MSM) is seeking physicians and physician assistants (PA's) serving patients in underserved and under-resourced communities in the following areas:

- ♦ Atlanta-metropolitan area
- ♦ Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC's)
- ♦ Healthcare Physician Shortage areas (HPSAs) in rural Georgia.









Objectives

- ♦ Develop leadership capacity in healthcare transformation for primary care professionals
- ♦ Increase integrated and coordinated care services within and between care settings
- ♦ Improve the quality of care in healthcare organizations
- ♦ Increase patient access to care

Overview of Activities

- ♦ CHAMPS fellowship is a 12-month training program and eligible hours of CME.
- ♦ Quarterly group and regular individual virtual meetings
- ♦ 2-3 in-person meetings
- ♦ Stipends



Key Instructional Components

- ♦On-line course instruction
- ♦ Virtual clinic site visits
- ♦ Monthly coaching sessions and technical assistance
- ♦ Healthcare transformation projects
- ♦ Monthly Reports



Transformative Leadership in Integrated Practice

The interactive online learning curriculum is comprised of three modules:

- ♦ Transformative Leadership
- ♦ Clinical Practice Skills
- ♦ Sustainability.







Clinical Practice Skills Module

Fellows will complete IHI on-line courses including the following:

- ♦ Teamwork and Communication in a Culture of Safety
- ♦ Introduction to the Triple Aim for Populations
- ♦ Improving Health Equity, Quality Cost and Value in Health Care







Coaching Sessions and Technical Assistance

- ♦ Meet with fellows monthly via tele-conferencing
- ♦ One-on-one training and assistance in developing clinical and leadership skills.
- ♦ Request as needed technical assistance regarding specific barriers and problem solve with coaches







Healthcare Transformation Projects

Fellows will select transformation projects that address critical needs for their health care institution

- ♦ They will conduct a Triple Aim needs assessment and develop a plan for projects.
- ♦ Learn the principles of data science and evaluation
- ♦ Fellows will be encouraged and incentivized to implement projects related to the HHS Clinical Priorities.
 - ♦ mental health, opioid abuse and childhood obesity.
- ♦ Projects will be presented at AHPA and Curtis A Parker research day.





Monthly Reports

Fellows will complete monthly reports describing efforts to implement change including the following components:

- ♦ Institutional readiness for change
- ♦ Institutional challenges to change
- ♦ Personal challenges to change
- ♦ New knowledge and resources that have aided and addressed institutional and patient needs
- ♦ Additional technical assistance and resources needed
