# MSM FACTS

### Degrees Offered:

We award the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.), Doctor of Philosophy in Biomedical Sciences (Ph.D.), Master of Public Health (M.P.H.), Master of Science in Clinical Research (M.S.C.R.), Master of Science in Biomedical Research (M.S.B.R.) and Master of Science in Biomedical Technology (M.S.B.T.) degrees.

### Students:

Student enrollment for 2011 - 2012 is 341. The Class of 2011 was comprised of 88 graduates, and 98 students are scheduled to graduate in 2012. Students continue to distinguish themselves on national certifying examinations. The Class of 2013 has accomplished a 100% Pass Rate on Step 1 of the United States Medical Licensing Examination.

### Research:

The school's research stature and reputation have grown substantially over the last decade, fueled in large part by significant investments in our research infrastructure with funding from the National Center for Research Resources and the National Center on Minority Health and Health Disparities of the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

MSM has received a cumulative total of \$288 million in research dollars from 2004-2010 for cutting-edge, disease-specific research and student research training opportunities. The outcomes of our research activities have resulted in the establishment of centers, institutes, and programs with our signature areas of research being cardio-metabolic diseases, cancer, HIV/AIDS, reproductive diseases and neurological disorders—all areas that disproportionately impact minority communities.

### Alumni:

The institution has graduated more than 1,275 students since 1981, several holding leadership roles of distinction. More than 54 percent of our alumni advance the mission of the school by serving in rural and urban communities; 64 percent of the Class of 2011 matched into primary care disciplines.
