

- **Dr. Yolanda Wimberly** was selected for Ebony Magazine's first ever Power 150 award



- NBME Subject exam scores up




- Accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (Commission on Colleges) requires a **Quality Enhancement Plan**

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Funding



- **G20 construction application for approximately \$10,000,000 funded**
 - The Medical Education Building research space (~ 19,140 sq ft) was targeted for renovation as the locus for consolidation of our research core facilities.

- **Primary Challenge**
 - Projected decline or plateau of NIH funding and the resulting impact
- **Strategies**
 - Enhance current partnerships and collaborations
 - Diversify our funding model to include government contracts, commercialization of new technologies and industry based partnerships
 - Recruit “magnet investigators” in select areas of research

The Clinical Enterprise

Grady Health System (GHS)

- GHS moves toward implementation of the EPIC electronic medical record (EMR) system by October 2010
- MSM, Emory and GHS continue to work toward a new affiliation agreement
- Continued improvement of financial position
 - 2010 deficit expected to be much smaller than in previous years
 - Philanthropic contributions helped fund long overdue capital needs

South Fulton Medical Center (SFMC)

- Family Medicine, Surgery and OB/GYN residents participate in rotations at SFMC
- Economic downturn and increased number of people without health insurance present challenges

Children's Healthcare of Atlanta (CHOA) opens new Hospital at Hughes Spalding

- 14 pediatric beds with capacity for 20
- New hospital aligned closely with CHOA Egleston and Scottish Rite

Atlanta VA Medical Center

- Internal Medicine is working with Atlanta VA and Emory to begin an inpatient internal medicine GME rotation in July 2010
- MSM continues to work with Atlanta VA on ambulatory residency education at the Atlanta VA community based outpatient clinics (CBOC)

Southern Regional Medical Center (SRMC)

- Currently, MSM has an affiliation with SRMC for residency training in gynecological oncology
- MSM and SRMC are exploring expanding GME opportunities
