Dr. Omar Danner Speaks with GPB Radio About Health Disparity of Gun Violence



Recently, <u>Dr. Omar Danner</u>, associate professor of Surgery at Morehouse School of Medicine and director of Trauma, Critical Care and Advanced Laparoscopy for Grady Health, <u>appeared on GPB Radio</u> to discuss his recently published research about the <u>health disparity of gun violence</u>.

"What prompted me to embark upon violence and injury prevention related research was seeing young people coming into the trauma center injured due to violence-related trauma night after night and day after day in almost predictable fashion," said Danner. "If you are an African-American male between the ages of 15 and 34, there is an eight to nine times higher chance of you being a victim of firearm violence than a Caucasian-American male of the same age group, which constitutes a significant health disparity."

Danner was joined by George Lee from the <u>End Gun Violence: Step Forward</u> initiative in Savannah on the show <u>On Second Thought</u> with host Tony Harris.
