Wayne Anderson, President Emeritus, Associated Colleges of the South (ACS); Search Consultant, Association of Governing Boards (AGB) Drawing on his recent publication, *Creative Collaboration: The Associated Colleges of the South*, Dr. Anderson will interview and engage in conversation with Dr. Beverly Tatum, president emerita of Spelman College and former chair of the board of the Associated Colleges of the South, about consortial challenges, lessons, and future prospects. Drs. Tatum and Anderson will raise questions about ways in which consortia can overcome challenges and difficulties in fostering collaborative thinking, responding to major institutional needs, and attracting active campus participation in collaborative activities. They will also focus attention on how consortia can learn important lessons on how to be relevant, how to offer useful innovations, how to build campus constituencies for cooperation, how to assess consortial initiatives and how to prepare for the future. The changing landscape has prompted calls for deeper collaboration but doing so often runs counter to the ways that institutions are measured and evaluated. What roles might consortia play with respect to improving institutional outcomes and how might consortia and accreditation bodies view their respective roles in advancing improved learning outcomes while making most efficient use of institutional resources? This interactive discussion is meant to prompt collective thinking about ways that consortia and accreditation bodies could work to ensure the best possible outcomes for students and institutions.
