

Case Study:

Leveraging reporting to improve curriculum and student performance

BACKGROUND

The Ohio State University College of Medicine is a four-year program, with a curriculum that integrates foundational and clinical science. Throughout the program, students work alongside expert faculty and staff at one of the nation's top academic centers, and gain hands-on experience through a longitudinal, practice-based clinical setting. The College of Medicine is driven by the mission to improve lives through innovation, research, education, and patient care.

RESULTS

THE PROBLEM

The Ohio State University College of Medicine wanted to implement an assessment solution that would enable faculty members to use student performance data to impact student learning outcomes during the semester, actively improve the curriculum, and support accreditation documentation. The institution's existing testing system did not offer faculty members the ability to categorize exam questions, provided limited reporting capabilities, and was often unreliable on exam day.

While faculty members were able to make broad assessments class performance, assessing individual or specific performance was much more difficult. Faculty members could not easily pin-point areas of weakness, limiting their ability to improve the curriculum or address student specific learning needs. In addition, faculty members were unable to accurately predict student performance on the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE), and lacked the data to assess students on the required competencies tested by the USMLE. Finally, students could not easily determine their own strengths and weaknesses - they often spent a considerable amount of time studying the wrong material, wasting valuable study time.

In addition reporting shortcomings, the existing system was often unreliable, and did not save or upload student answers properly. Moreover, students were forced to take exams in multiple shifts due to computer lab seating limitations, creating inconveniences for students, staff, and faculty.

THE SOLUTION

ExamSoft gives the Ohio State College of Medicine the ability to easily create assessments, and categorize questions in a variety of ways, including by subject, competency, cognitive process, learning objective, and USMLE focus area. With one click of a button, faculty members easily generate reports containing robust information on student and exam performance. This information is then used to identify areas of low performance, and dedicate more class time to discussing those problem areas. Faculty members also use this data to predict students at risk of failure, and intervene.
