Advancement of Health Equity

ATLANTA – April 15, 2015 – Morehouse School of Medicine (MSM) will begin a year of celebration with the school's Annual <u>Hugh M. Gloster Society Donor Celebration</u> on Thursday, April 16, 2015. <u>Dr. Louis W. Sullivan</u>, MSM's founding dean and president and now president emeritus, will be awarded the Louis C. Brown Vanguard Award for his leadership and impact on health disparity. Throughout the year, the institution will celebrate 40 years of excellence during many special events. MSM will honor the past, present and future and celebrate the leaders, researchers, students and medical professionals who have made an indelible impact on the institution.

"A good health interchange requires a well-trained professional who has the appropriate knowledge base and is culturally competent to work effectively with his/her patients," said Dr. Sullivan. "We depend upon institutions like Morehouse School of Medicine to produce all kinds of health personnel to serve our society. I am honored that MSM has presented this award to me."

An Atlanta native, Sullivan currently serves as chairman of the National Health Museum and chairman of the Sullivan Alliance to Transform the Health Professions. He has served as chair of the President's Commission on Historically Black Colleges and Universities and was co-chair of the President's Commission on HIV and AIDS. He served as U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services from 1989-1993.

"As we prepare for the next 40 years, MSM will continue to engage in meaningful work that makes a difference in the lives of others and that translates and transforms into communities. Our programs and services extend the vision of our founders, today creating and advancing health equity to the global community," said <u>President and Dean Valerie Montgomery Rice</u>.
